Dignity returned: Kathleen's story

The Human Impact of Philanthropy

When Kathleen first stepped into the Mobile Care Clinic she braced herself for the worst. Being unhoused and with a history of substance abuse made getting healthcare difficult.

"It's obvious when I go into the clinic I'm homeless," Kathleen said. Her previous experience had made her feel less than the housed patients around her, like she was rushed through and talked over.

But as a former CNA with 20 years experience under her belt, Kathleen also knew how important it was to get healthcare. So when the Mobile Care Clinic rolled up to her neighborhood, she went.

"The whole staff there treated me like a human being. They asked a lot of questions, and even if it was clear you had been through stuff, they didn't treat you any differently. They even asked me if I needed glasses, which I did."

Now a regular to both the Mobile Care Clinic and the Family Care Clinic, Kathleen says she feels like staff and clinicians not only know her, but get excited to see her.

"This is exactly why we are here," said Niki Appiah, Community Health Navigator, "For people with a history of substance abuse. For people who are unhoused. Everyone is a human being and we are committed to quality healthcare no matter what your circumstances are."

Since its launch in 2024, the Mobile Care Clinic has served over 1,000 patients. That's 1,000 people who may not have any sort of clinical care at all in the last year. Individuals can struggle to get healthcare due to lack of mobility, insurance, or in Kathleen's case, stigma.

Philanthropy bridges both gaps of coverage and access. Through grants, passionate donors, and healthcare advocates, the Mercy Medical Center

Merced Foundation is able to fund programs like the Mobile Care Clinic, supporting the purchasing of equipment, salary of staff, and continued investment to ensure updated programs and technology.

Technology update: the ION machine

A grain of rice.

That's how small we can screen growths for lung cancer.

This big machine with an eye for the smallest detail brings state of the art electromagnetic navigation bronchoscopy with 3D image mapping to Merced, enabling precise detection of smaller lung nodules for earlier diagnosis and improved patient outcomes.

This technology was made possible through the combined forces of physician partnership, the Central California Alliance for Health, and Mercy Medical Center Merced Central Merced Foundation.

Rural communities like Merced have historically faced challenges in accessing the same level of care found in urban areas. Fighting this inequity is one of the key missions of the Foundation.

The ION machine is more than technology. It's a promise to our people: you can breathe easy, we're fighting for you.



Since the arrival of the ION bronchoscopy technology, Mercy Medical Center Merced has performed dozens of screenings. Earlier detection means better health outcomes and peace of mind to cancer patients and their families.



Intensive Care Unit beds

Our third annual Golf Classic was a tremendous success, raising \$86,000 specifically for new ICU beds. Demand for intensive care in Merced has risen 31% since 2017.

Thanks to community support, we're bringing three new ICU beds to Mercy Medical Center Merced. This event perfectly demonstrates how community support directly translates into life-saving equipment for our most critically ill patients.
